

EXPRESSION OF INTEREST – FORMING OF A PANEL OF LAWYERS

The Embassy of India, Kingdom of Bahrain is requesting proposals from interested law firms/lawyers for form a panel of 4-5 lawyers for a specific period who may be consulted/engaged ("Consultant") by the Embassy for providing legal assistance, whenever required, in matters relating to Indian nationals who are living in Bahrain.

A. SCOPE OF WORK

1. The Consultant to be hired by the Embassy of India will provide legal assistance service to Indian nationals in Bahrain. The detailed scope of work includes all, but not limited to the following activities:

(i) To provide legal assistance services to Indian nationals referred by the Embassy of India in wide range of cases such as pending salaries; final settlement; passport retention of workers with companies; indemnity cases; breach of contract cases, unfair termination of employment contracts, determining other financial rights of employees etc.

(ii) To provide legal assistance services to Indian nationals referred by the Embassy of India who have committed minor crimes, offences or have been falsely implicated by their employer and put in jails, which includes all kinds of work related offenses against employees/fishermen/seamen/sailors/Indian students in distress / domestic servants and persons regarded as such namely gardeners, house security guards, nannies, drivers and cooks for carrying out their job duties for the benefit of an employer or his relatives etc.

(iii) To provide legal assistance to the Embassy of India for release of Indian nationals who have completed their prison sentence; filing bail applications in respect of those qualifying for bail; filing of applications for remission of sentences in cases of petty offences; assistance to Indian migrant workers who have been abused/cheated/tortured by their employer/sponsor/ insurance company.

(iv) To represent and proceed with all kinds of cases related to Indian women abandoned/cheated/abused by their NRI/PIO or foreign spouses.

(v) To represent and proceed with all kinds of Compensation Claims for the assigned persons of the Embassy of India before the various Courts of Bahrain.

(vi) To interact/or advise the aggrieved Indian nationals and their witnesses assigned from the Embassy of India and assisting them for gaining speedy, quick remedies for their grievances.

(vii) To represent on behalf of the assigned Indian nationals in litigation and other legal proceedings before the various Courts, arbitration panels, administrative bodies of Kingdom of Bahrain.

(viii) Drawing up pleadings and other related litigation document/or legal documents to support the assigned persons.

(ix) To examine the legal data, assign lawyers and affix signature in pleas, power of attorneys or the transactions whose performance requires a lawyer's signature.

(x) To present and summarize cases to judges and or juries and officials and meet with officials if and when necessary.

(xi) To prepare reports on the work assigned to the legal consultant.

(Xii) To represent the distressed workers/or Indian Citizens in various compensation claims including work accident claims and to avail a speedy successful remedy.

(Xiii) To transfer immediately the received payments/or amounts on behalf of the claimants (Indian Nationals) either awarded by a Court of law /or out of Court settlement /or by other means, to the personal bank account as designated by the Claimant and to provide the Embassy promptly about the details/or proof of transfer.

B. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

(i) The lawyer must be registered under the relevant Bahrain Law and should have all applicable/appropriate licenses in their own name, a copy of which has to be submitted with the Technical Bid.

(ii) must have a team of Legal Expert with at least 1-2 junior or associate lawyers.

(iii) Legal expert and associate lawyers must have a Bachelor in Law or equivalent degree from a recognized university with professional experience of at least 3-5 years.

(iv) Knowledge of Arabic and English Language of the legal expert is must.

(v) One page synopsis may be enclosed describing/highlighting the major achievements of the law firms in civil/criminal cases in last 3 to 5 years.
